The MIWG Director of Emergency Services is first and foremost, here to serve and assist any staff position that needs assistance as well as mentor any staff member that may need guidance. Directs and coordinates the Emergency Services (ES) Staff. The Director of Emergency Services reports to Michigan Wing command staff regularly on behalf of the MIWG ES Staff, coordinates between ES Staff and Director of Operations, and ensures MIWG Emergency Services Programs are at or above all National Standards. The Director Position bears responsibility to ensure that the Wing is doing everything able to serve as well as be able to serve other agencies in Preventative Search and Rescue (PRESAR), Search and Rescue (SAR), Disaster Relief (DR), Humanitarian Services (HS) (such as Blood, Vaccine, Sand Bagging, etc), Homeland Security (HLS), and assistance to Civil Air Patrol Partner Agencies holding Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) with CAP (Such as Michigan State Police, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), American Red Cross, Air National Guard, Coast Guard, Salvation Army, etc.)

Lt Col Jason Sherwood joined Civil Air Patrol (CAP) in 1996 as a Cadet Member. During time as a cadet, he served in many job duties including Cadet Commander and Cadet Advisory Council Representative as well as serving at two Operation Wolverines, once as a Ground Team Member and the other as Public Affairs Officer. Shortly after Achieving the Billy Mitchell award, he transferred to the Senior Member Program in 2000, completing Level I in 2001. After completing Level I, Sherwood became the Public Affairs Officer for the then called Muskegon Composite Squadron. By 2003 he was also serving in several other roles within the squadron. In Nov 2004 he took on the Role of Unit Commander. As unit Commander numbers at the Unit numbers went from single digits to over 30. Upon the end of term in 2007, the Squadron had a Vehicle Assigned and could easily staff two full ground teams. In 2007 Sherwood began working under the Wing ES Staff assisting with receipts and financial and administrative assistant type areas. In 2009 he became an Assistant ES Training Officer and has since served in multiple different areas among the Wing ES Staff. In 2014 he also began serving the Wing Finance Officer in doing Financial Auditing for the Wing, a position he still works in. Lt Col Sherwood was assigned to the Michigan Wing Director of Emergency Services on 01 Oct 2021 and hopes to serve in the role for the next 3-6 years.

Civil Air Patrol Awards and accomplishments include serving on countless actual and training missions, Completion of Basic Ground Team Training Course NESAs, Advanced Ground Team Training at MIWG ES Academy, Aircrew School NESAs, Ground Team Leader School MIWG ES Academy, Aircrew Survival MIWG ES Academy, Incident Command School NESAs, and a great deal of other completed courses and trainings. He holds one Meritorious Service Medal, 6 Commander's Commendations, Search and Rescue Ribbon, Find Ribbon, as well as many other awards and decorations.

Outside of CAP, Lt Col Sherwood attended Baker College from 1997 to 2001 studying in Aviation Technology and Management. He still holds a Pilot License although isn't an active Pilot in Command (PIC). After college, with 9-11 he followed a path into Business Management instead of Aviation in his professional life. He worked in many areas of Management at Menards from 2000 till 2012. For Menards he helped with many Store Startups/Buildings as well as incorporation of an Electronic Data Interchange system (EDI) for product ordering, shipping, and receiving. From 2012 till 2014 he tinkered at a few different companies in Shipping and Receiving positions before starting at Inontime Logistics in Zeeland in 2014. He is an Employee Owner at Inontime Logistics based out of Zeeland, MI. There he helps to manage over 70 (of the companies over 300) team members and part of the

company's fleet of over 100 vehicles. He works within areas of Customer Service, Dispatch, Project Leader, Ownership Boards, and helps create and develop new business processes.

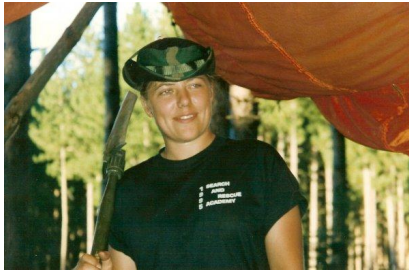

The MIWG Emergency Services (ES) Training Officer is responsible for creating and maintaining the MIWG ES Training Events calendar. The DOST facilitates and coordinates the creation of the annual training plan and ensures all wing level training events and programs coincide with the objectives and goals set annually in the E-Services Online Flying and Training Plan for the Wing. They work closely with all other ES Staff to ensure that all training activities and goals prepare members for the needs of our real-world customers. They mentor and guide Assistant ES Training Officers as they create and work on programs to train wing members in Incident Management Team (IMT), Aircrew (MP, MO, MS, AP, DAART), and Ground Team (UDF, GTL, GTM) positions. They ensure that required supporting documentation of each new and requalifying member is maintained in e-Services and/or Web Mission Information Reporting System (WMIRs) as appropriate. The DOST recruits, assists, and mentors Project Officers and Incident Commanders to support training programs and encourages members to gain new and retain previously held Emergency Services Operations Qualifications (OPSQUALS). While the Wing Commander retains sole approving authority of the Incident Commander Qualification, the ES Training Officer is delegated the authority to validate (or not validate) all other Wing Level ES Qualification Approvals.

Lt Col Sheila Cerny joined Civil Air Patrol as a cadet in 1987 because she heard that CAP “was a bunch of kids who go out and fly around looking for crashed airplanes, and you can get called out of school and you can get called out in the middle of the night.” While that description of the program was inaccurate on a few counts, there were enough other things that cadets can do in Emergency Services that she decided to stay. Over the years, she has been heavily involved in both the Cadet Program and Emergency Services, and has served as a Squadron Commander and Group Commander, in a variety of Wing staff positions, and as the Michigan Wing Encampment Commander. Most notably, she noticed a need for consistent, quality ES training across the wing ten years before National introduced standardized task-based training, and founded the Michigan Wing Search and Rescue Academy to fulfill that need in 1994. She commanded the Academy for fourteen years and served as a Course Commander for an additional three years.

The MIWG Sim Cell and Ground Team Training Programs Officer reports to and is mentored by the Emergency Services Training Officer. This position is responsible for creating and maintaining a program to support realistic training scenarios (simulations) that can be used in all training events, both at Wing Level as well as ones that the Groups, Squadrons, and any Skills Evaluator can utilize for training efforts. They will act as the Simulation Cell (Sim Cell) officer and/or be able to support others in the Sim Cell position for Wing level training events. In addition to all of this, they also make as many efforts as possible to create and support programs that help to train others in the areas concerning Ground Teams. That would include supporting and mentoring anyone who is in need as they work at Wing, Group, and/or Unit Levels to train in the areas of Ground Branch Director (GBD), Ground Team Leader (GTL), Ground Team Member (GTM 3, 2, and 1), and Urban Direction-Finding Team (UDF). The MIWG Emergency Services Officer (ESO) is responsible for maintaining and processing requests for use of the money attached to our Annual Training Missions that support Aircrew, Ground Teams, and those training to use the Web Mission Information Reporting System (WMIRs). The ESO may delegate to any member of the Emergency Services (ES) Staff the ability to help approve and maintain documentation and support under those missions in conjunction with the ES Training Officer (Such as the Sim Cell and Ground Team Training Officer approving Ground Team Training Requests).

The ESO submits all E-108's not submitted otherwise by an Incident Commander or Finance Admin Section Chief of an activity for any and all WMIRs Mission Numbers that pertain to the ES Programs of Michigan Wing (MIWG). The ESO also helps to monitor and advises the DOS on all financial budgets as well as supporting documentation for the "bang for the buck." The ESO audits and assists the wing ES Staff in all things involved with Emergency Services that will become a matter of official record within E-Services and WMIRs that pertain to Financial and Administrative Obligations for ES we have as prescribed by Civil Air Patrol-United States Air Force (CAPUSAF), National, Regional , and Wing (NHQ, GLR, and MIWG), MIWG Director of Operations (DO), and the MIWG Director of Emergency Services (DOS).

Colonel Leo Burke serves as the Michigan Wing Director of Homeland Security. He is responsible for developing strong relationships with State and Federal Agencies, Military, STEM related Industry groups, businesses and universities to expand CAP's presence and to promote STEM activities. In 2020, Colonel Burke was the incident commander leading the staff of five hundred and eighty-five State, Federal and military personnel at a two Covid field hospitals in Michigan.

Previously, he served as the Great Lakes Region (GLR) Vice Commander (Missions). He was responsible for ensuring that the six wings and more than 6,000 CAP professionals achieved their goals and participate in CAP's Congressionally chartered missions; Aerospace Education, Cadet Programs, and Emergency Services. Prior to that Colonel Burke served as the Commander of Michigan Wing. He was responsible for ensuring that the 1,300 members and the 48 units in Michigan were prepared to meet the operational needs of CAP and to ensure that they were given leadership training to prepare for the future. He has commanded at the Squadron, Group and Wing level. Colonel Burke has served at both Wing and Region levels as: Vice Commander, Director of Operations, Director of Cadet Programs, Director of Safety, and Director of Homeland Security. He has served on the National Safety Committee, the National Information Technology Functional User Group and the National Logistics Review Team.

He holds commercial pilot ratings for single & multi engine airplanes and gliders. He is a CFII with more than 3,100 flight hours. He has more than 1,800 hours of CAP pilot time, including 600 hours as CAP instructor and check airman. He was the Aircraft Commander of the first aircrew to be awarded the Air Force North/1AF Commander's Award (2006) for the Most Meritorious CAP Homeland Security Mission. He was awarded a second Air Force North/1AF Commander's Meritorious Mission Award (2012) for serving as a Mission Staff Officer in CAP's response to Superstorm Sandy. For his actions during an inflight incident, he was Michigan Wing's Distinguished Aviator for 2019. In June 2021, he was named Civil Air Patrol's National Incident Staff Member of the Year.

Colonel Burke serves additional duty as an Incident Commander (IC1), CAP Check Pilot, Check Pilot Examiner, Mission Pilot, Mission Check Pilot Examiner, and holds or has held nearly every ICS/NIMS qualification including Incident Commander, Mission Pilot, Air and Ground Operations Director, and Ground Team Member. He has served as an Incident Commander (Mission Coordinator) for more than 150 missions. He has been intercepted by USAF, USCG and CBP aircraft more than fifty times during homeland security exercises.

For the National Guard in Michigan, Indiana, and Ohio most of our "missions" that we serve in also fall under the Homeland Security umbrella. For these reasons, the HLS Officer is our primary liaison to build and maintain relationships with the Michigan State Police and Air

National Guard. The MIWG HLS officer ensures we have adequate leadership to support Intercept Missions, Low Level Route Surveys, Operation Northern Strike, Michigan State Police Emergency Operations Center Incidents, etc. Through the relationships with the mentioned agencies and any agency that falls under a Homeland Security umbrella that the HLS Officer builds and maintains, the HLS Officer advises the ES Staff on needs and possible future requests that may need integrated into other ES Trainings and Events. The HLS Officer being the key person selling CAP to primary State and Federal Agencies and acting liaison to those agencies also serves as a Mentor to all ES Staff, MIWG Groups, and MIWG Units in selling CAP to other agencies, building relationships with possible customers, and maintaining those relationships.

This MIWG Alerting Officer Develops and maintains programs and standard operating procedures that are available for squadrons, groups, as well as Incident Commanders to support rapid alerting of MIWG Emergency Services Qualified Persons. Maintains WMIRs Alert Roster for Incident Commanders and ensures the top 5 on the alert roster are the appropriate Incident Commanders that 9 times out of 10 if called can accept an incident on behalf of MIWG. In creation and maintenance of alerting procedures and standards designed as recommendations for use by Incident Commanders (IC's) as well as Project Officers (POs). The Alerting Officer has regular conversations with the IC's, POs, as well as the Homeland Security (HLS), Search and Rescue (SAR), and Disaster Relief (DR) Officers to discuss and either adjust procedures or create additional alert procedures to ensure that when we are called upon to serve we have methods we can utilize to gather assets and personnel to support the needs of missions and incidents. Also works with our Wing Informational Technology Officer (IT) and/or assistants in ensuring have online methods of reporting and mass texting/contacting of members in addition to any other written guides drafted.

The Deputy Director of Emergency Services (DDOS) is currently performing this role in addition to other duties as this is one that we must continue to fill. If you are interested in filling this role within the Emergency Services Staff, please reach out to the Director of Emergency Services (DOS). Applicants should have good working knowledge of how to create documents, computer working knowledge to support using and testing new systems, time and energy to perform "tests" of alerting procedures, as well as have drive to ensure we are always able to put our best and brightest equipment and members out in the field working for our customers. Applicants should also either already possess or be working towards the Operations Qualification (Ops Qual) of Operations Officer and also an Emergency Services Specialty Track Rating.
